Kirk's View from 30,000 feet



I thought I would take you south and east in this edition to The Blue Ridge Parkway, a place I discovered in 1996-1997. It is a beautiful spot and one that I highly recommend for its natural beauty and its heritage. This roadway is a National Parkway and All-American Road in the United States, noted for its scenic beauty. It is America's longest linear park that runs for 469 miles through 29 Virginia and North Carolina counties linking Shenandoah National Park to Great Smoky Mountains National Park. It runs along the spine of a major mountain chain that is part of the Appalachian Mountains. Its southern most point is at U.S. Route 441 on the boundary between Great Smoky Mountains National Park and the Qualla Boundary.

Construction began in September 1935 and lasted until 1966 and one part of the project around Grandfather Mountain did not open until 1987. The entire construction project lasted 52 years.



The Blue Ridge Parkway has been one of the most visited of the National Park System every year since 1946. The land on either side of the road is owned and maintained by the National Park Service. The roadway is not maintained in the winter and sections that pass over, especially high elevations and through tunnels, are often impassable and therefore closed from late fall through early spring. The speed limit is never higher than 45 mph and is lower in some sections. There are also numerous parking areas at trailheads for the various hiking trails that intersect the parkway. Several campgrounds located along the parkway allow for overnight stays. Mount Mitchell (the highest point in eastern North America at 6,684 feet) is only accessible

via North Carolina Highway 128 in the parkway. A couple of famous movies that have been shot in or near this area are "The Last of the Mohicans" and "The Green Mile". If you ever get a chance to visit, I would strongly suggest a trip to this part of the country.
